WHAT IS THIS PRODUCT?

Type

International Equity is a Sub-Fund of Olympian SICAV (the “Fund”). The Fund consists of separate classes of shares constituting segregated sub-funds which are segregated patrimonies. The Fund is incorporated under the laws of Luxembourg, having its registered office at 11-13 Boulevard de la Foire L-1528 Luxembourg, Grand Duchy of Luxembourg and licensed by the LBR under license number B79640.

Objectives and Investment Policy

The investment objective of this Sub-Fund is to achieve capital appreciation.

The Sub-Fund invests in leading companies in products, process and market (especially with pricing power) regardless of geographical location and sector.

The Sub-Fund principally invests in equity instruments – mainly of medium and high capitalisation - denominated in the three main world currencies: U.S. Dollar, EUR and Yen; however, the Sub-Fund may invest in securities denominated in other currencies. The geographical sectors of the investment are principally European Union, North America, Pacific and Emerging Countries.

The investment in equities may involve the combined use of stocks, all eligible ETFs (with no geographical limitations), derivatives and third parties’ UCIs. The Sub-Fund will not invest in leveraged ETFs.

The Sub-Fund may invest occasionally (especially in specific market conditions, in case of lack of opportunities in the equity markets) in bonds and debt instruments including but not limited to government bonds, bonds issued by supranational institutions, bonds and notes issued by local authorities or agencies, mortgage bonds MBS, corporate bonds and other debt instruments with a focus on US, EU, Japan and Emerging Countries. Investments in MBS will in no case exceed 10% of the total net assets of the Sub-Fund.

Benchmark and Strategy

The Sub-Fund reference benchmark is 90% MSCI ACWI in local currencies and 10% Merrill Lynch Euro Currency LIBOR 3-month Constant Maturity. The Sub-Fund is actively managed. The Management Company has full discretion over the composition of the Sub-Fund’s portfolio, subject to the investment objective, policy and restrictions stated in the Fund’s Prospectus.

Dividend policy

The Sub-Fund does not intend to distribute dividends. Any income arising from the Sub-Fund’s investments is reinvested and reflected in the value of your shares. However, the annual general meeting of shareholders may decide to distribute such income.

Term of the Product

The product has been established for an indefinite period of time. You can buy, sell and switch shares in the Sub-Fund by providing instructions within 1 business day prior the Redemption Day as outlined in the prospectus of the Sub-Fund. The Directors may in their exclusive discretion limit the total amount of redemptions effected on any Redemption Day to 10% of the outstanding Investor Shares in the Sub-Fund on that day.

Practical Information

The Sub-Fund’s depositary bank is CACEIS Investor Services Bank S.A. The NAV is calculated on a daily basis and is published on the Management Company’s website. This KID is specific to the Class of the Sub-Fund. However, the Prospectus and the annual, and half-yearly, financial reports are prepared for the entire Fund. These documents are available free of charge, in English, on the Management Company website.

Intended institutional investor

The Sub-Fund aims to meet the needs of institutional investors who are willing to hold their investment for a medium term.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS AND WHAT COULD I GET IN RETURN?

Risk Indicator



The risk indicator assumes you keep the product for 5 years. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage, and you may get back less.

You may not be able to cash in early. You may have to pay significant extra costs to cash in early. You may not be able to sell your shares in the Sub-Fund easily or you may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this Sub-Fund compared to other Funds. It shows how likely it is that the Sub-Fund will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this Fund as 4 out of 7, which is a medium risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance at a medium level, and poor market conditions could impact the Sub-Fund's capacity to pay you.

Be aware of currency risk. You may receive payments in a different currency to the base currency of the Sub-Fund, so the final return you will get depends on the exchange rate between the two currencies. This risk is not considered in the indicator shown above.

Beside the market risks included in the risk indicator, other risks may affect the Sub-Fund, including counterparty risk, credit risk, liquidity risk, operational risk and investment risk.

This table shows the money you might could get back over the next 5 years, under different scenarios, assuming that you invest EUR 10,000. The scenarios shown illustrate how your investment could perform. You can compare them with the scenarios of other products. The scenarios presented are an estimate of future performance based on evidence from the past on how the value of this investment varies and are not an exact indicator. What you get will vary depending on how the market performs and how long you keep the product. WHAT HAPPENS IF ABALONE ASSET MANAGEMENT LTD IS UNABLE TO PAY OUT?

This Sub-Fund is a sub-fund of Olympian SICAV, which is a Company organised under the laws of Luxembourg as a multi fund investment company with variable share capital (SICAV). The Company consists of separate classes of shares constituting segregated sub-funds which are segregated patrimonies. The assets of the product are segregated from the assets of Abalone Asset Management Ltd and they are deposited with the depositary. A default of Abalone Asset Management Ltd does not have any impact on the value of your investments in the Sub-Fund.

WHAT ARE THE COSTS?

The person advising on or selling you the Sub-Fund may charge you other costs. If so, this person will provide you with information about these costs and how they affect your investment.

Costs over time

The tables show the amounts that are taken from your investment to cover different types of costs. These amounts depend on how much you invest, how long you invest in the Sub-Fund and how well the Sub-Fund does. The amounts shown here are illustrations based on an example investment amount and different possible investment periods.

We have assumed:

- In the first year you would get back the amount that you invested (0% annual return). For the other holding periods we have assumed the Sub-Fund performs as shown in the moderate scenario
- EUR 10,000 per year is invested

(*) This illustrates how costs reduce your return each year over the holding period. For example it shows that if you exit at the recommended holding period your average return per year is projected to be 4.3% before costs and 3.7% after costs.

We may share part of the costs with the person selling you the Sub-Fund to cover the services they provide to you. They will inform you of the amount.

HOW LONG SHOULD I HOLD IT AND CAN I TAKE MONEY OUT EARLY?

Recommended holding period: 5 years

The Recommended Holding Period (RHP) of this product is 5 years which is the period over which an investment into the product is expected to break-even. Please note that this is not guaranteed. The more your actual holding period differs from the product's Recommended Holding Period, the more your actual risk of losing money will deviate from the product assumptions. If you wish, you can redeem before the RHP at the Net Asset Value of the product. Also, you might have needs and constraints implying a completely different holding period suitable to you. Thus, we recommend you discuss this point with your financial advisor. The investor can redeem their shares on every Redemption Day.
